2. Planning Module – Hunter Minor Subdivision – By unanimous vote, a motion (Kommelasky-Palestina) was passed approving the adoption and submission of Resolution R-06-10, to the Department of Environmental Protection for a revision to the official sewage facilities plan of Northampton Township for a Planning Module on behalf of the Hunter Minor Subdivision.
3. Tree Donation – Chairman Komelasky announced that 5 trees will be planted Saturday, April 29th in honor of Arbor Day at the new Senior Center by State Senator Tomlinson and State Representative Petri, also 2 trees will be planted at the Rescue Squad Building. 
